Dr. Barry Goldstein joined Covance in December 2013 as Global Therapeutic Area Head for Cardiovascular, Metabolic, Diabetes, Endocrinology and Renal disease, and is based in Princeton, NJ. He is Board-certified in Endocrinology and Diabetes and has over 25 years of experience in clinical and basic research & development in both academia and industry.

His postdoctoral research and clinical fellowships were at the Joslin Diabetes Center and Brigham and Women's Hospital, both of Harvard Medical School. He spent 16 years at Jefferson Medical College as Professor and Division Chief expanding basic and clinical research programs, elevating the reputation of the clinical

practice to a tertiary referral center and establishing a robust Phase II-IV clinical trials unit in Diabetes and Endocrinology. While at Jefferson, Dr. Goldstein was Principal Investigator (PI) or Co-PI on nearly 100 clinical trials.

Prior to joining Covance, he spent 5 years at Merck Research Laboratories as Vice President and Therapeutic Area Head for diabetes and endocrinology where he was responsible for the research & development of Merck's Phase II-IV clinical portfolios in diabetes, osteoporosis and women's health products (including contraception and fertility) and evaluating related external assets for potential in-licensing or acquisition. He convened translational teams to develop proof-of-concept study designs. In late development, he supervised clinical teams in the comprehensive management of the therapeutic area development programs, including overseeing clinical trial strategy and protocol authoring, clinical input to regulatory filings and inquiries, responses to payers and clinical aspects of pharmacovigilance and post-marketing observational and epidemiological studies.

He regularly engages external scientific leaders in advisory boards and other consultations and supervised clinical trial data review and presentations for national and international scientific meetings and numerous publications. Dr. Goldstein is a recognized leader in diabetes research and clinical practice; he is a past Associate Editor of DIABETES and JCEM and has served on many grant review panels for NIH, ADA, JDRF as well as industry scientific advisory panels. His contributions to the literature include more than 220 papers, editorials, monographs, textbook chapters and co-editorships.

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
